#### JOHN GRIERSON ARCHIVE

#### G1 / Personal papers to January, 1927

### **Scope and Content:**

Grierson graduated from Glasgow University in 1923 with honours in moral philosophy, logic and metaphysics. His studies had been delayed by the First World War - he served in the Royal Navy Volunteer Reserve as a telegraph operator on minesweepers from 1916 - 1919. After a short time working at the University of Durham as assistant registrar Grierson won a Rockerfeller scholarship to the University of Chicago where he was a research fellow in political science studying immigration and its effects on the US. While in America Grierson began to write about film for various publications.

Material relating to this period of Grierson's life includes notes and essays written while a student at Glasgow University; notes for sermons preached in Scottish churches (c 1920); papers relating to Grierson's time in the US including notes and drafts of articles on film; photocopies of papers relating to Grierson from Glasgow University Library.
