Scope and Content:

In 1927 Grierson returned to Britain after a period in the USA studying at the University of Chicago and writing about film. He approached Stephen Tallents, secretary of the Empire Marketing Board, with ideas about developing film as a method of communication for the Board, a promotional body for the products of the British Empire. Tallents, who shared Grierson's views, employed Grierson as a film officer. It was during his time at the Empire Marketing Board that Grierson directed Drifters, an acclaimed documentary about the British herring fishing industry. The film owed a great debt stylistically to Russian filmmakers such as Eisenstein, indeed Drifters was first screened in London in November 1929 as part of a double bill with Battleship Potemkin (Grierson had worked on the English titles for the film). Following the success of Drifters Grierson oversaw the production of a series of Empire Marketing Board films including Industrial Britain (1931). In 1933 the Empire Marketing Board (and its film unit) was abolished. Tallents was appointed public relations officer for the General Post Office. Grierson followed and set up the GPO film unit.

Material relating to this period of Grierson's life includes: production material including outlines, scripts and music suggestions for Drifters; Empire Marketing Board material including correspondence, reports produced by Grierson and notes and production material for films planned and produced by the Board; material relating to international film activity including papers of the International Motion Picture Congress (1927 - 29); film criticism and articles on cinema from various publications; mss and typescript reports, articles and lecture notes; typescript versions of unpublished book entitled New Worlds for Cinema on the use of film in education and by the church; press cuttings (including reviews of Drifters); notebooks including drafts of articles and notes on documentary filmmaking; photocopies of papers relating to the Empire Marketing Board from the University of Texas and the British Postal Museum and Archive, London

G2 begins with Grierson's invitation by Stephen Tallents to prepare memoranda on the use of films in various countries with a view to setting up a film unit for the Empire Marketing Board. It covers *Drifters* and Grierson's time as Film Officer of the Empire Marketing Board and includes much film criticism as well as other writing on documentary and film in general. For the sake of continuity and convenience, the regular columns of film criticism which Grierson wrote at this time, although they extend from June 1929 to February 1934, have been kept together within this section.
