

JOHN GRIERSON ARCHIVE

Scope and Content:

After leaving the National Film Board of Canada in 1945 Grierson developed a number of projects in the USA including 'The World Today', a series of educational and documentary films for worldwide distribution. His plans were adversely affected by the publicity surrounding an investigation into an alleged Soviet spy-ring at the National Film Board of Canada - the spectre of communists at the NFB led to the US refusing Grierson a visa in February 1947. He returned to Europe and took up the post of Director of Mass Communication and Public Information for UNESCO in Paris. In April 1948 he left Paris for London where he was appointed Controller of Films at the Central Office of Information. Grierson's plans for developing the COI's film output, including the work of the Crown Film Unit, were frustrated by political opposition and financial constraints and he left the COI at the end of 1950.

Material relating to this period of Grierson's life includes accounts, financial papers, reports and papers relating to The World Today Inc; official papers and notes and reports written by Grierson while at UNESCO and The Central Office of Information; papers relating to visit to South Africa for the Imperial Relations Trust in November 1949; articles, lecture notes and speeches written and given by Grierson on a variety of subjects; general correspondence; papers relating to film organisations collected by Grierson; notebooks containing drafts of articles and letters; articles, press cuttings and miscellaneous publications collected by Grierson; photocopies of material from Forsyth Hardy and British Film Institute relating to this period of Grierson's life.
